Barbara Martin, with the help of friends, has made a quilt, which you could win! It will be

raffled off on November 30. Barbara, a long-time SLO Quilter, worked at Cal Poly for many years with her friend Lee Dana. Currently, Lee's young grandson Mateo is fighting for his life to win a battle with cancer.

Here is a brief version of Mateo's journey: At two years of age he was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia and began three years of treatments. He earned a nickname - "The Beast" - because, in his grandma's words, *"He is one of the toughest, strongest, kindest, funniest, and loving boys I know."*

After attending his first week of kindergarten this fall, his family received the bad news that Mateo had relapsed; this time with Central Nervous System Leukemia in his spine. He is about to begin another three years of treatments at L.A. Children's Hospital. Of course the medical and travel expenses are staggering. Would you be willing to help this little boy and his family?

Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order by President Dian R at 7 PM – Tonight's program will be first followed by the business meeting. Guests: Jayne Snyder, Barbara Pfister, Rose Bloomfield
New Member: Marianne Peterson
Program (5X5): Barbara M - 5 guild members and a retrospective of their quilting careers. Julie T, Dede L, Irene D, Janis B, and Sue F shared their quilting journey from the beginning to present, including mistakes they made, what they learned and have accomplished. Each participant shared 5 quilts that were examples of their quilting experiences. Dian R told of her first experience with a small quilt (hand stitched) that became a chair cover.

Youth Coordinator: Tammy R – All were encouraged to work with a child – sew something simple, “plant the seed”. There will be a 6-week class at Betty's on Sundays from 1-3 in the spring with machines provided. Ages 9-15, one on one with a small patchwork quilt as the result. Tammy showed an example with purple/lavender squares. Pre-cut kits consisting of 63 6” squares will be given to each participant. Hopefully backing and binding will be purchased at Betty's. Sewing, not cutting fabric, will be the emphasis. Kit donations will be welcomed, pieces of batting also needed for “Franken-Bat”. Five helpers will be needed for the classes.

BOM: Karen H – this month's 9-patch is Indiana Puzzle, a 12” block. Examples of two versions

were shown using three fabrics. This is #5 of BOM. After #6, participants will have 12 blocks to put together. Instructions found in newsletter and also on back table. Opportunity Quilt: Susan K – Members are encouraged to make small quilts for the show – 12” by 18” maximum size. Make a special, small quilt utilizing the theme “what brings you Joy”. Quilts will be displayed on Sat and Sun with coffee can raffle format. Drawings to be held at end of each day.

Hospitality: Sue B, Jeannie C – 16 items were won!

Coffee Can Raffle: Julie T – 10 items raffled.

AQGCC: Sue B – rack cards/book marks for 2018 quilt show available on back table
