SLO Quilters Block of the Month Mystery

Clue #3

You will continue cutting your fabric and construction of the block

TWELVE BLOCK QUILT

Fabric B—cut 3 strips 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric cut 24 pieces 4 1/2"

Background G—cut 3 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric cut 24 pieces 4 ½"

NINE BLOCK QUILT

Fabric B—cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric cut 18 pieces 4 1/2"

Background G-cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric cut 18 pieces 4 ½"

SIX BLOCK QUILT

Fabric B—cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x wide of fabric cut 12 pieces 4 1/2"

Background G—cut 2 strips 2 1/2" wide x width of fabric cut 12 pieces 4 1/2"

Sew a Background G to a Fabric B to create a square.

For Twelve Block Quilt you will need 24 of these units.


For Nine Block Quilt you will need 18 of these units.


For Six Block Quilt you will need 12 of these units.


**CHECK DIRECTION AND PLACEMENT BEFORE YOU SEW!!

Sew pairs of squares together as shown.

Sew resulting unit to side of Clue #2 block as shown.


We will have a special speaker at the luncheon and reveal the outcome of our "Challenge" quilt competition.
