SLO Quilter's Opportunity Quiltlette Raffle

We received a lot of positive comments about the display at the Seven Sister's Quilt Show, which was created by Carol Wilcher and Susan Knowles. We raffled 20 quilts and 5 small quilt

stands . . . so we had 25 winners! The first day receipts were about \$250 with a grand total for the weekend of \$440 including \$16 credit card charges. Customs tickets cost \$77.89 and resulted in \$18 in presales. Credit card processing fee was 45 cents. So the net proceeds were \$370.66. Many thanks to the volunteers who created our beautiful mini quilts and helped run our booth.


